Stewardship

As we review and reflect upon the readings for any given Sunday, it is good to try to connect what is proclaimed with our lives and our understanding of stewardship. A key word for us to notice today comes in the first reading from Ezekiel and it is "Watchman." We may think of a watchman as a kind of security guard, but that is not exactly what the word meant in Ezekiel's time. It was synonymous with "steward." This is God declaring that Jesus, the Son of Man, is appointed the steward of Israel and all of us as well. The appointment is from God, not from a human. We are called in the same way, by God, to be good stewards.

Ice Bucket Challenge: The Ice Bucket Challenge is all over the news. The story is you are supposed to either dump a bucket of ice cold water over your head or donate to ALS research. ALS is Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis, or Lou Gehrig's Disease, which is a fatal, progressive neurological disease. So raising awareness about ALS and getting monetary support for ALS research is a good thing, right? Not so fast. ALS Association has admitted giving some of its money to embryonic stem cell research. This is the research that leads to the death of tiny human embryos. But there is good news. There are alternatives for donations that use only ethical stem cell sources. The Midwest Stem Cell Therapy Center (MSCTC) at the University of Kansas Medical Center uses only adult and non-embryonic stem cell research in clinical trials.

Protecting God's Children – VIRTUS Training: VIRTUS which derives from Latin and means valor, moral strength, excellence and worth — is the brand name that identifies best practice programs designed to help prevent wrongdoing and promote correct actions in religious organizations. The VIRTUS program, "Protecting God's Children" helps people recognize improper behavior and is required for all clergy, employees and volunteers who have contact with children, young adults or vulnerable adults. 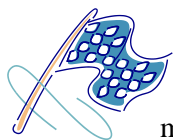
