Pastor's Corner

We call today Gaudete "Rejoice" Sunday and the readings emphasize the theme of joy. The spirit of the liturgy all through Advent should be one of expectation and preparation for the feast of Christmas as well as for the second coming of Christ. However, the penitential exercises are suspended today in order to symbolize the joy and gladness of the promised Redemption.

What does the Gospel have to do with joy though? Luke gives us a series of questions which various people pose to John the Baptist as they seek to put their lives in order. He tells them to repent of their present way of living and to take on something positive and new. People in general are to practice justice by giving from their superfluity, not only regarding property but the giving of themselves to good works. As they prepare for the coming of Christ they should discover joy in affirming a new identity and appreciate fully the gift of a life well lived. God bless you all.

Stewardship Reflection

"Shout for joy!" With that exclamation our First Reading from the prophet Zephaniah begins. We are told to "Sing joyfully" and to "Be glad and exult" as well. St. Paul in his letter to the Philippians proclaims, "Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice!" Why are we so joyous? St. John the Baptist explains it in our Gospel reading from St. Luke: "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming." Indeed...the Lord is coming, and soon, and that is why we are called to "Rejoice" on this Gaudete Sunday.
