## Pastor's Corner

We begin Holy Week with Palm Sunday and we have the Passion read, this year according to St. Luke. We will hear it again on Good Friday but it will come to us from St. John. Luke stresses Jesus' innocence but He is sent before both Herod and Pilate – neither wishing to get involved though they know him to be innocent – they valued their own safety and their political careers more important. We see the forgiving nature of Jesus right to the end when he forgives the “good thief” and indeed asks that all his murderers be forgiven.

Today's Passion could be used as a kind of examination of conscience to prepare for the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday & Easter). In reflecting on the Passion it could be helpful to ask ourselves the following questions: How do we figure in the story? Are we one of the crowd who cried for Jesus' blood? Are we Pilate or Herod who knew Jesus to be innocent but did not save him? Are we one of the apostles who fled, Are we Judas who betrayed him and failed to seek forgiveness? Are we one of those who mocked and spat on him?

Hopefully we will identify with ourselves with St. John or as one of the Mary's – faithful to the end. I often meditate on the sufferings of Jesus because they have given me strength during difficult times. May Christ's sufferings give you strength also. We look to victory and a joyous Easter, but we must never forget Good Friday. May God bless you all.

## Stewardship Reflection

What better call could we have to stewardship than the week we are about to enter. During Holy Week we can serve our Church with our time and talents as we participate fully in the various liturgies – especially the Holy Triduum. We can support Christ's works by being especially generous and responsible in our giving. We can witness to the world that no matter how it militates against Him, we are His stewards and will follow his wishes of true stewardship at this time and always. We should remember that the Cross, for all of its sorrow, pain, and despair, is also a sign of freedom and hope. We are called to transform any suffering into infinite love through our stewardship.
