I'm sure many of us are familiar with the Greek myth which has Narcissus, to cut long story short, withering away because he sees his reflection in a pond and falls in love with himself – seeing all the things for which he himself is admired. We have many narcissists nowadays in both politics and, if one is fair, generally in modern society. So many people seem devoted to exaltation of self rather than including love of God and others.

Sirach is not like this; he considers that wealth or poverty do not influence God's hearing of people seeking justice. Even though God does have a great love for the poor and the oppressed and will always be attentive to them. Justice is important and God has revealed that he wants us to be at peace with acting as He would in regard to all others.

Zacheus is identified as a sinner in need of God's mercy even though he is well off. "Justification" takes place for him because he is converted by becoming aware of a relationship with God – he is not on God's level, he needs a relationship which trusts in God and not in his own worth. Zacheus seeks out Jesus and is transformed. May we all seek Jesus, and the will of God and true justice. God bless you all.

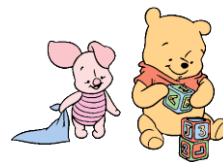
