Pastor's Corner

Today's brief passage from Isaiah urges us to think of our lives in terms of fundamental relationships – such as a child's dependence on its mother. A good mother will never abandon or harm her child in any way but it does of course happen in the case of far too many mothers nowadays. God would never forget His child. We can feel safe and happy always in His embrace.

Mammon refers to the perishable things of this earth, like wealth and/or a preoccupation with acquiring wealth. This brings forth anxiety as do other worldly fantasies and desires. Jesus wants us to be joyful in the things that are of the present but lasting.

If we serve Jesus by striving to live his way, we will avoid the stress and misery which come from trying to serve two masters. Yes, we are to live in the present, not being lackadaisical and impractical, but putting our energetic faith and trust in what will really count both in the here and now and in the hereafter. Stewardship Reflection

Paul today basically tells us that we are meant to be faithful in order to be good disciples, stewards, and servants. We have to place ourselves second to others and second most of all to Christ our Savior. We tend to question this and tend to have strong feelings of independence. That is what we learn from our society. Yet, to be a steward like Paul requires us to be humble and accepting.

St. Augustine wrote, "What does love look like? It has the hands to help others. It has eyes to see misery and want. It has the ears to hear the sighs and sorrows of others." That, too, is stewardship.

Little Black Books & Rice Bowls: The black book should help your growth in humility and charity. Your offerings in the Rice Bowls will demonstrate your ability to put charitable thoughts into action. Bring the Rice Bowls back with your change by Easter

Fasting & Abstinence: During the Lenten Season, we exercise works of charity and fulfill our responsibilities more faithfully by fasting and abstaining. **Fasting:** To be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics from age 18 - 58. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals (snacks) are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs. **Abstinence from Meat:** To be observed by all Catholics age 14 onwards on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Though these are the rules, we might consider them the least we can do to make a good Lent. Every healthy person should be able to refrain from eating meat once a week. We can save money and place it in our Rice Bowls to help the poor.

Voluntary Self-Denial: As well as giving up something, deeds of mercy, acts of kindness, participation in daily Mass, saying the Rosary, Lenten Devotions, and Stations of the Cross are also encouraged.

St. Patrick's Day, Friday, March 17: Bishop Quinn grants a dispensation from abstinence from meat and meat products to all Catholics in the Diocese of Winona on St. Patrick's Day.
