## Pastor's Corner

Melchizedek, the mysterious character who flits in and out of the bible leaving a profound message in his wake is identified as the King of Salem, therefore we have the connection with the Holy City of Jeru-Salem hundreds of years before David. Melchizedek offers bread and wine which we see as a foreshadowing of the Eucharist and Abraham does homage by offering tithes. The core of what will become the Church is apparent.

The notion of the "eternal priesthood" of Melchizedek, his having no earthly lineage, certainly has an effect on our understanding of the permanent character of ordination and the irrevocability of the priestly commitment.

Melchizedek, in its Canaanite meaning, is "king of saving Justice" and this helps us to see the meaning of the high priesthood of Jesus. With the aforesaid, it is founded upon Christ's complete identification with eternity and with a compliant people in need of sacrifice.

Last week we saw how difficult it was for the Apostles to grasp what Jesus was saying about His ultimate sacrifice but in Bartimaeus' case we encounter one who is able to see deeply, who accepts Jesus' priesthood and the mystery of salvation. He is well prepared for the journey he must make. We too must be accepting of the priesthood of Jesus which He passed on through the Apostles. We should realize that we, people in need, should turn to His sacrifice, celebrated in the Eucharist, for eternal salvation. God bless you all.

## Stewardship Reflection

After Jesus has responded to the blind man's calls for mercy and healing, and the Lord has told him that it was his faith which had saved him, the Gospel tells us of the former blind man, Bartimaeus, "Immediately he received his sight and followed him (Jesus) on the way." What is noteworthy about this is that at time and for the first years after Jesus' Resurrection His disciples were called "followers of the way". They recognized Jesus as the way to live and the way to salvation. (Jesus stated more than once, "I am the way.")

Bartimaeus, most likely, was with Him all the way. Are we willing to follow the Lord on such a journey? That is exactly what He is asking us to do through our stewardship.

**Adult Choir:** We will sing at Mass on Sunday, November 1. Meet at 8:50 am for practice.

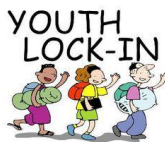
