Pastor's Corner

Today's feast of the Epiphany, traditionally January 6th, comes to us somewhat early. We at St. Bernard's and St. Bridget's will keep Christmas alive a little longer by leaving our decorations in place until next week, when we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord.

The Christmas event, the birth of Jesus, is intensified today by our celebration of the Epiphany. The Lord Jesus is for all nations. We might imagine ourselves as travelers seeking the fulfillment of all human longings.

The account of the arrival of the Magi is only found in Matthew. We find great drama in their journey from the "east" and great significance. The gift of Jesus is for all people of goodwill no matter their circumstance or origin. Thanks to the gift of the Word made Flesh, no one is to be considered an outsider. We should therefore feel built up by this event, made all the more alive.

The actual gifts the Magi brought the Christ Child, gold, frankincense and myrrh are prognosticative of the Savior's death. This death will show the glory of God forever as it frees us humans from sin and eternal death. Let us enjoy the great feast then, giving God thanks for his precious gift and all it means to us. Stewardship Reflection

This day of Epiphany or "revelation", is filled with symbolism; it is filled with stewardship. For us as stewards it is well to take note of two important aspects of this story. Jesus' birth was first revealed to humble and plain shepherds. The revelation for those considered more honorable and learned, namely, the Magi, occurred much later. Another perspective is that Jesus came to the poor first, and then the rich. However, rich or poor these first viewers of the revelation responded well spreading the news of what they had seen.

We are called to respond, through stewardship. We are called to more than just follow the Light of Christ. We are called to act and to do something to show that we are indeed disciples. That would make us as wise as the Magi. Jesus came, and comes to everyone, us included.
