Pastor's Corner

In the long version of this weekend's Gospel we encounter the parable about the Prodigal, or wasteful, son. If we were to survey people's reaction to this parable we would discover that it irritates a lot of people, as did the parable about the workers in the vineyard where the late comers get as much pay as the early risers. This gets under our skin and that is Jesus' intent.

Many think that the youngest son is simply an irresponsible wastrel, the father is a fool and the eldest son is hard done by. We must humbly admit however that all of us might mirror the behavior of the prodigal at one time or another: immersing ourselves in godless and passing preoccupations. We might be tempted also to mirror the self-righteousness of the elder son – it is hard to be right all the time. But how about being as loving and forgiving as the father?

There is nothing foolish about the father's extending his mercy. The idea is that, if given out of love mercy will heal. The younger son is to be pitied because he did not lead a fulfilling life until he saw the bigger picture. What he had sought was empty but, if accepted in the right spirit, he can now have joy and purposeful love. God bless you all.

Stewardship Reflection

In the First Reading from the Book of Exodus, God speaks to Moses. In the midst of revealing to him what the Israelites have done and how they have violated His trust in them, the Lord says, "I see how stiff-necked this people is." God may consider us to be stiff-necked at times, might He not? In spite of the Lord's appeals to us to trust Him and to follow Him, we sometimes stiffen and resist. If we are going to accept the challenge of living stewardship as a way of life we must realize that it is not always easy, and it may put us in positions where we feel uncomfortable and even vulnerable. We need to trust the Lord, and we need to pray to Him. He will respond with love and mercy.
