Pastor's Corner

A Biblical Scholar once posed the question, "If you were put on trial for being a Christian, would there be enough evidence among those close to you to convict you of being a disciple of Jesus Christ?" That is more or less the demand that Jesus makes of us in today's Gospel. Do we live God-centered lives? Do we seek and pursue daily conversion and rebirth? Jesus reminds us "whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me." A Cross represents death, and that is the same kind of dying and renewal and conversion to which St. Paul refers in this week's second reading. When we are called, as were the Apostles and St. Paul and Elisha, every fiber of our being is included.

Discipleship demands ultimately a renunciation of the world in order to place God first and Jesus makes that clear. Even where family and other relationships are concerned, our relationship with God must take center stage. Some family situations may impede the living out of the Gospel, after all, and so in the case of conflict, the Kingdom of God is to be preferred over the establishment of the family.

Just as Elisha in our first reading enjoyed the hospitality of the Shunemite woman so Jesus pledges that the one who follows Him unreservedly will be the recipient of much joy and hospitality, however, with the privileges of the faith will also come very real sacrifices and responsibilities. Enjoy your Independence Day celebrations but remember, we are always dependent on God. May He bless you always.

Stewardship Reflection

Our first reading today is filled with hope, but it also is a reminder of God and salvation. We often focus on the idea of stewardship and Elisha is an excellent example of a good steward leading his life by serving others and closely following God. Elisha reminds us that as stewards we are called to lead God-centered lives, even when that may seem impossible or difficult.

We are called to discipleship and stewardship, but to fulfill that calling we will only find our lives by losing them, and we can only live by dying. In order to experience the enduring resurrection in our lives we must be willing to take up the Cross of being a Christian and a steward in what we do and how we live.
